Saturday, July 28, 2018 we will meet at the Main Branch Library upstairs in the D.E. Room for about 30 minutes before we hop on a small tour bus and depart around 1:30p.m. to make the 0.9 mile drive to the Finding Our Roots African American Museum at 918 Roussel Street in Houma for a guided tour. The tour bus has 20 seats and currently there are 8 spots still available for anyone interested in attending. Anyone interested in coming but not comfortable riding on the bus or if all spots are claimed by the time we leave can follow the bus in their own vehicle. The cost to tour the museum is \$9/person. The board of officers approved covering the cost of the tour bus and guided tour as a membership benefit for the first 20 people to sign up. All others will need to purchase an admission ticket at the door. The tour is expected to last approximately one hour. The tour bus will bring us back to the library around 3pm.

The Finding Our Roots African American Museum is the first museum dedicated to preserving the history and culture of black communities in Terrebonne, Lafourche and St. Mary parishes. The museum is housed in the white wooden schoolhouse formerly known as "The Academy" where black students attended during segregation. The museum has galleries focused on slavery, the Reconstruction era, segregation and the Civil Rights Movement. **NO REFRESHMENTS WILL BE SERVED AT THIS MEETING**.

Last month our guest speaker David Platter spoke on the St. John Episcopal Cemetery. An interesting fact is that the cemetery is laid out in the shape of a cross. There is no perpetual care for the cemetery and the descendants are not taken care of the tombs. Signs have been placed to identify where someone is buried and a brief history. He also spoke about the Live Oak Tour where some of the Live Oaks are being logged and named. David is a former owner of Acadia Plantation and he said the plantation is made up of seven farms. Thank you, David for sharing your stories with us.
